Dear Friends in Jesus Christ,

Jesus began His public ministry by saying; "Repent and believe in the Gospel, for the Kingdom of God is at hand." Today, as we celebrate the feast of the Ascension of our Lord, we hear the closing words of Jesus: "Go into the whole world and proclaim the Gospel to every creature. Whoever believes and is baptized will be saved; whoever does not believe will be condemned." By these closing words, Jesus reminds us that our Christian faith and life are not personal, but something that must to be shared with everyone; but, how many of us are conscious of this primary responsibility as a Christian or as a Catholic?

To make us aware of the seriousness of this responsibility only Jesus came to us through different sayings on each weekend's Gospel after His resurrection. At first, Jesus tried to convince us about His resurrection by appearing to His disciples and promising them peace by showing them His five wounds. Secondly, Jesus taught us about the importance of the Word of God in our lives, by sharing and opening the minds and hearts of the disciples through the Word of God. Thirdly, Jesus reminded us about the importance of the Holy Eucharist by saying; "I am the bread of life. Whoever comes to me will never hunger and whoever believes in me will never thirst." Fourthly, Jesus came to us as a good shepherd saying; "I am the good shepherd, I know mine and mine know Me.....and I will lay down my life for the sheep...and they will hear my voice." Fifthly Jesus taught us to be united with Him by saying; "I am the true vine, and you are the branches. If you remain in me and I in you, you will bear much fruit; apart from me you can do nothing." Last weekend Jesus came to us reminding us about the importance of Love.

After having reminded us of our Christian responsibility, Jesus is ready to leave this world to enter into heaven. This is what we celebrate through the Ascension of the Lord. It marks the end of Jesus' mission as God made man and now it is our turn to continue the mission here in this world, and so Jesus says: "Go into the whole world and proclaim the Gospel to every creature. Whoever believes and is baptized will be saved: whoever does not believe will be condemned." The Ascension also reminds us that we are on a journey and heaven is our final destination.

In our first reading, Luke gives us a brief summary of the life of Jesus up to His dramatic ascension into heaven. There are two messages of hope for us. The first is the promise of the Advocate: "...But you will receive the Holy Spirit ... and you shall be my witness...to the ends of the earth." This means is that Christ is not leaving us as orphans; instead, he

remains with us through the Holy Spirit "till the end of time." The second is the promise of His return. So, today we also celebrate hope because Christ has gone to prepare a place for us in His kingdom, that one day He shall return to take us to be with Him.

However, it is important to note that while we wait and prepare for Christ to return, we are not supposed to remain idle like the apostles did at the scene of the ascension: instead we are expected to live productively. This is what the second reading and Gospel reminds us. In the second reading, St. Paul reminds us to lead a life worthy of Christ by saying, "Bear with one another charitably, in complete selflessness and in patience. Do all you can to preserve the unity of the spirit by the peace that binds you together." When we come to the Gospel reading, St. Mark encourages us to be productive by reminding us of our mission; "Go out to the whole world; proclaim the good news to all creation..." As Christ evangelized and commissioned us, it is now our duty to evangelize our brothers and sisters thus, becoming more active in our ministries. To be an effective missionary of Christ in this world, let us ask the Eucharistic Lord to renew the Spirit that He gave us freely through His sacraments. God Bless.

Guidelines for Resuming Parish Gatherings Outside the Liturgy

- The dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation remains in place.
- Effective immediately, the Diocese is adopting the Governor's new protocol regarding masking outdoors. Parishes and Schools MAY choose to NOT require a mask during OUTDOOR activities if the group size is less than 1,000. This applies to the Liturgy, picnics, playgrounds, sporting events, youth groups or any other outdoor activities.
- Nothing has changed for indoor gatherings. We have no way of knowing when protocols for inside activities will change, but we are reviewing the CDC and State's directives on a daily basis. Things are changing rapidly, but there are still some instances where transmissions and quarantines are occurring. So please continue to exercise caution and follow the guidelines for indoor gatherings until we receive further notification from the State. Please remember that here is always an assumed risk, even if they are considered low risk.
- Three-foot distance should be maintained between households.
- Children aged two and under are not required to wear a mask. It is imperative that everyone over the age of two be masked properly. Those unable to wear a face mask at the event. whether it be due to age (the CDC does not recommend those under the age of two to wear a mask), health condition, or preference, are asked to stay healthy at home. Conduct temperature and health checks for each participate.
- Choirs may resume but must be masked and placed three feet
